On the Move with Children?

Moving with a family can be stressful at the best of times. Whether you have a bouncing baby or a trending teenager we all want to make the move easier on them and us as parents! We have put together some helpful hints to set the scene for an easier transition and a little less heartache.

- When browsing for homes, discuss the reason for the move with your kids. Take them to open homes (do remind your lovelies that best behaviour is required). Ask them which room they like best? Get them involved by asking for their input.

Record NZ Median Prices

The latest statistics released by real estate institute of New Zealand (REINZ) shows NZ's median house price has reached an all time high of \$597,000 for the month of September 2019, beating the previous record of \$585,000 set in March earlier in the year.

The ongoing supply/demand imbalance has continued to drive real estate prices up by over 6% per annum, in spite of the overall inflation rate of just over 2% per annum. The demand for housing is driven by the increase in NZ's population, made up of net immigration, which currently sits at an annualized rate of 53,000 people per year, and natural population increase due to the difference in the birth and death rates, and add 25,000 people per year (0.5% of the population). At an average house occupancy of 2.3, this means an additional 33,000 houses are required per year to house the additional population.

The supply has been improving with the number of houses consented per year increasing from 33,000 in 2018 to a projection of 37,000 in 2019. Although these numbers seemingly show supply is meeting demand, several factors are not accounted for. Firstly the building consent numbers do not show how many houses are demolished to make room for the new ones, secondly not all consents are actually constructed, and finally there is typically a one year lag between consent and the house being ready to be occupied.

These factors mean supply is still below demand and combined with record low interest rates it is likely prices will continue to rise for the foreseeable future.
